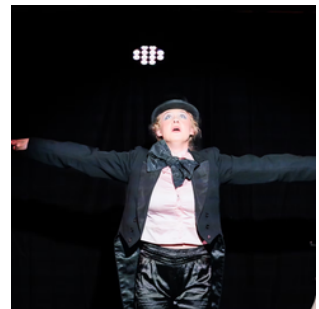


Closure Cabaret
